Elkins Common Council met in regular session in the council chamber of city hall at 7:04 p.m. Thursday, March 1, 2012. Present were Mayor Duke Talbott; Councilpersons: N. E. Bross-Fregonara, V. T. OLD BUSINESS

911 Mapping and Addressing

Council heard a presentation on 911 mapping and readdressing from Marvin Hill, director of the Randolph County Office of Emergency Management, and Jim Wise, director of the Randolph County E911 center.

According to Mr. Hill, the main benefit of the readdressing is that it will make it easier for emergency personnel to locate people who have called 911 to report an emergency. Because the addresses will comply with state and national standards, Mr. Hill said, even emergency workers without local knowledge would be able to locate and communicate about the addresses of persons in need of assistance. According to Mr. Hill, other potential benefits of the new address system include eliminating address patterns that might currently confuse utility and delivery workers.

Mr. Hill stated that, in order to fully comply with national and state E911 standards, the address number of every building in the city would have to be changed. To reduce confusion, it is recommended but not mandatory that similar-sounding street names also be changed. Mr. Hill further stated that all areas of Randolph County, including all Randolph County municipalities other than Elkins, have elected to adopt and are proceeding with the new 911

readdressing. He told council that the United States Postal Service will deliver mail using both old and new addresses for one year after any change.

Mr. Wise advised council that, unless Elkins adopts the new addressing system, the city might be exposed to liability in the event of mishaps arising from confusion about city addresses. The city attorney advised council that state code includes a provision relieving local governments of liability for acts of both commission and omission related to 911 readdressing.

Cm. Broughton, seconded by Cm. Woolwine, MOVED THAT, TO GAIN PUBLIC OPINION ON THE PROPOSED E911 MAPPING/READDRESSING PROJECT, COUNCIL HOLD A PUBLIC FORUM IN COUNCIL CHAMBERS ON MONDAY, MARCH 12, 2012 AT 7 P.M., AND THAT THE CITY CLERK ANNOUNCE THIS MEETING TO THE PUBLIC. <u>The</u> <u>motion carried.</u>

Council recessed from 8:25 to 8:35 p.m.

Planning Commission

Mayor Talbott reported that he had polled the existing members of the Elkins Planning Commission. He learned that the commission has not met for at least two years, and that the existing members are not interested in meeting again absent explicit new guidance from council concerning objectives and proposed undertakings for the commission.

Cw. Bross-Fregonara and Cm. Scott said that an active commission could help the city ensure a desirable consistency in the many ongoing and upcoming public and private construction, beautification, and infrastructure projects.

Cm. Hensil, seconded by Cw. Cuonzo, MOVED THAT COUNCIL ADOPT RESOLUTION 300, WHICH DIRECTS THAT PUBLIC NOTICE BE MADE OF VACANCIES ON BOARDS, COMMISSIONS, AND OTHER BODIES. Cm. Scott, seconded by Cm. Hensil, MOVED THAT COUNCIL AMEND THE PROPOSED WORDING OF RESOLUTION 300. The amendment was to strike the following paragraph:

"Whereas, as provided for in the Elkins City Code, ordinances, resolutions, and state law, the appointment of many of the members of the Boards, Commissions and other bodies is to be approved by Common Council upon the nomination of the Mayor; and,"

The mayor stated that the purpose of Resolution 300 is only to advertise openings, not to change any aspect of the existing appointment process for any board or commission. <u>The motion to amend carried</u>. <u>The amended motion carried</u>. Council further directed that Resolution 300 would not apply to a pending reappointment to the Parks Commission and a pending appointment to the Tree Board. <u>The motion carried</u>.

Cm. Hensil, seconded by Cw. Cuonzo, MOVED THAT COUNCIL ADOPT RESOLUTION 301, REVISING THE CRIMINAL FINES SCHEDULE. The motion carried.

Cm. Woolwine, seconded by Cw. Cuonzo, MOVED THAT COUNCIL ADOPT RESOLUTION 302, AUTHORIZING THE ELKINS POLICE DEPARTMENT TO CHARGE A \$15.00 FEE FOR FINGERPRINTING PERFORMED FOR NON-ARREST-RELATED PURPOSES, SUCH AS EMPLOYMENT AND HOUSING BACKGROUND CHECKS. Cw. Cuonzo advised council that the only other local entity offering this service is a private business, which charges \$28 for local residents and \$48 for non-local residents. The motion carried.
