Elkins Common Council met in special session in the council chamber of city hall at 7:00 p.m. Tuesday, April 17, 2012. Present were Mayor Duke Talbott; Councilpersons: J. S. Bibey, N. E. Cm. Woolwine, seconded by Cm. Hensil, MOVED THAT COUNCIL REQUEST THAT THE RANDOLPH COUNTY COMMISSION PAY ONE THIRD OF THE COST OF THE LEVEE CERTIFICATION, WITH ONE THIRD BEING PAID FROM THE ELKINS GENERAL FUND AND ONE THIRD BEING PAID FROM THE ELKINS WATER FUND. Cw. Cuonzo recommended that the Randolph County Commission be requested to pay half of the levee-certification costs. Cm. Hensil, seconded by Cm. Scott, MOVED TO AMEND THE ORIGINAL MOTION TO INCREASE THE PAYMENT AMOUNT REQUESTED OF THE RANDOLPH COUNTY COMMISSION FROM ONE THIRD TO ONE HALF. The motion to amend carried. The amended motion carried.

Cm. Bibey, seconded by Cm. Scott, **MOVED THAT COUNCIL APPROVE A TRAVEL REQUEST FOR SGT. JUDY TO ATTEND AN INSTRUCTOR DEVELOPMENT COURSE IN WHEELING, MAY 14-17.** At Cm. Woolwine's request, Lt. Richards explained that the course satisfies a state requirement that police officers receive instructor training before being certified to provide instruction in specific subjects, such as firearms, within their departments. Cm. Woolwine sought assurance that this certification would not result in Sgt. Judy being called away from his duties in Elkins to provide training to other departments. Lt. Richards said that, although Sgt. Judy would be eligible to provide training to other departments, he would only be allowed to do so during his personal time. <u>The motion carried.</u>

The council recognized Sanitation Worker John Iseli as Employee of the Quarter. Sanitation Supervisor T. Roth accepted the award on his behalf.

Cw. Cuonzo, seconded by Cm. Woolwine, **MOVED THAT COUNCIL ADOPT RESOLUTION 325, APPROVING PAYMENT OF AN INVOICE RELATED TO THE RANDOLPH AVENUE WATER-LINE REPLACEMENT PROJECT.** Treasurer Daniels-Smith announced that the amount shown on the resolution did not match the amount shown on the invoice. The correct amount was \$31,065.54, as shown on the invoice. Cm. Scott, seconded by Cm. Bibey, moved to amend the original motion by requiring correction of this error. <u>The motion to amend carried.</u> <u>The amended</u> <u>motion carried.</u>

Police Chief

At Cm. Broughton's request, Lt. Richards discussed shoplifting incidents in the Elkins area.

Fire Chief

Chief Meader reported that the Fire Department received a grant from the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources for \$3,500 and used it to purchase two automated external defibrillators (AEDs). With these purchases, the department now owns four AEDs.

MAYOR'S COMMENTS

911 Committee

Mayor Talbott advised council that, as of April 13, he had finished making appointments to the ad hoc Elkins 911 Committee created by motion of council at the meeting of March 15, 2012. The members are: Randall Biller (citizen member), Fire Chief Tom Meader, Greg Schumacher (citizen member), City Clerk Sutton Stokes (chair), and Police Chief Rob White. It was confirmed that the committee's 45-day deadline will be counted from the date of its first meeting. The mayor observed that each of the city's five wards is represented on the committee.

Wastewater Treatment Plant Audit

The mayor drew council's attention to a letter from the West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection advising the city that a recent audit of the Elkins Wastewater Treatment Plant had found no deficiencies and resulted in a score of 100; a score of 80 or better is required for recertification.

Appreciation for Great Tygart Valley River Clean-Up

The mayor expressed appreciation for the many volunteers who assisted with the Great Tygart Valley River Clean-Up. At the mayor's request, Cm. Scott described his own experience participating in the clean-up and said that it had been a successful event.

OTHER BUSINESS

Cm. Woolwine asked what the official procedures are for adding or removing agenda items. Cm. Scott said that the Rules and Ordinance Committee would soon be considering recommendations for this and other meeting-related rules.

The meeting adjourned at 8:02 p.m.

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
