# ELKINS COMMON COUNCIL REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

401 Davis Avenue Council Chamber, 2nd Floor October 19, 2017 7:00 p.m.

Elkins Common Council met in regular session in the council chamber of city hall. Present were Mayor Van T. Broughton; Councilpersons R.C. Chenoweth, M. D. Cuonzo, C. Friddle, III, M.M. Hazen, C. L. Metheny, E.R. Ochsendorf, D.C. Parker, and L.H. Vest; Police Chief G. Galloway; City Treasurer T. Judy; Fire Chief T. W. Meader; City Attorney G. S. Roberts; Operations Assistant M. Himes; City Clerk J.R. Sutton (acting as recording secretary); and Inter-Mountain Reporter T. McVean.

C.C. Lowther, R. A. Woolwine and Operations Manager R.P. Pingley were absent.

### **PUBLIC COMMENT**

Andy Mendleson of 32 High Street urged the City to work with the County Commission to prevent the recently announced closure of the Suddenlink office in Elkins. Mr. Mendelson also expressed his support for the proposed municipal sales tax, including what benefits a similar tax has produced for other municipalities. Finally, Mr. Mendleson thanked the City for taking care of the smell at the wastewater treatment facility near Riverbend Park.

Martha Metheny of 1700 Taylor Avenue is displeased with the proposed one-percent sales tax without seeing a plan of how that money will be spent. She believes it should directly benefit downtown business owners.

Robert Mullenex of 44 Sugar Run Road in Montrose is frustrated by the first due fire fees.

Cm. Ochsendorf MOVED APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE SEPTEMBER 21, 2017. The motion carried.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

Cw. Hazen MOVED APPROVAL OF ORDINANCE 246: AMENDING CITY CODE CHAPTER 8, ARTICLE II, FIRE PREVENTION CODE (2<sup>ND</sup> AND FINAL READING). The motion carried.

Cm. Ochsendorf MOVED APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 1064: APPROVING THE PROMOTION OF AND ESTABLISHING A NEW COMPENSATION LEVEL FOR G.L. BROWN AND M.J. SIGLEY. The motion carried.

Cm. Ochsendorf MOVED APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 1065: AMENDING AND IMPLEMENTING POLICY CONCERNING SUPPLEMENTAL LONGEVITY PAY FOR POLICE OFFICERS. The motion carried.

Cw. Hazen MOVED APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 1066: CITY OF ELKINS WATER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT CHANGE ORDER NO. 4 TO CONTRACT NO. 4. The motion carried.

Cw. Hazen moved approval of Resolution 1067: City of Elkins water system IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT CHANGE ORDER NO.7 TO CONTRACT NO.1. The motion carried.

Cw. Cuonzo MOVED APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 1068: APPROVING INVOICES RELATING TO THE WATER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT AND AUTHORIZING PAYMENT THEREOF. The motion carried.

Cm. Metheny MOVED APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 1069: PARTIAL TERMINATION OF DEED COVENANT AND PARTIAL SURRENDER OF REVERSIONARY INTEREST FOR 911 CENTER PROPERTY. Cm. Chenoweth recused himself from the vote due to his law firm serving as general counsel for the Elkins-Randolph Airport Authority. The motion carried.

Cm. Metheny MOVED APPROVAL OF THE ADDRESS CHANGES ON THE WILSON LUMBER PROPERTY RECOMMENDED AND PRESENTED TO COUNCIL BY CITY CLERK J. SUTTON. The motion carried.

Cm. Parker MOVED APPROVAL OF THE ADDRESS CHANGES IN THE HIGHLAND PARK AREA RECOMMENDED AND PRESENTED TO COUNCIL BY CITY CLERK J. SUTTON. The motion carried.

Cm. Friddle spoke to council regarding the proposed municipal sales tax. He believes the B&O tax to be regressive and hopes that implementation of a one-percent sales tax would eventually allow for the elimination of the B7O tax entirely, at least in the retail category. Cm. Friddle also reported that estimates show a generation of \$800,000 annually for the City with the implementation of a one-percent municipal sales tax.

Treasurer T. Judy presented information on the FY2018 revenues and expenditures. Cm. Chenoweth advised council that he is opposed to the municipal sales tax because he feels that it is contrary to the City's goal to foster downtown businesses. Cm. Chenoweth also advised that he has spoken to multiple downtown business owners who would like to know what the

Chenoweth also advised that he has spoken to multiple downtown business owners who would like to know what the revenue will be spent on. Finally, Cm. Chenoweth reported that he would prefer to consider internal cuts in expenditures and annexation instead of a tax. Finally, Cm. Chenoweth advised that Cm. Lowther asked that he express his opposition to the municipal sales tax for similar reasons.

Cw. Cuonzo spoke in favor of the municipal sales tax, stating that municipalities are restricted in how they can generate revenue. She would like to see any new revenues used in part for downtown improvements, City Hall maintenance and increases in salaries for City employees. Finally, Cm. Cuonzo advised council that in her nearly ten years of service as a councilwoman she has never seen financial waste.

City Clerk J. Sutton provided information to council regarding what the sales tax is applied to, who must collect and submit the tax to the state and the fact that there are currently forty-two municipalities in West Virginia who has implemented a municipal sales tax. Finally, the Clerk reported to council that she has met with volunteers to help coordinate a sales tax open house with the purpose of education and solicitation of input from the public. The details will be provided as they are confirmed.
