Joining with the WV House of Delegates and Governor Jim Justice, the City of Elkins proclaims the second Saturday of September to be designated as “Heroes Day” in West Virginia in tribute to Firefighters, Law-Enforcement Officers and Emergency Medical Service Workers who are dedicated to helping those in need and protecting the public.

WHEREAS, Firefighters, Law-Enforcement Officers, and Emergency Medical Services Workers are on call twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week; and

WHEREAS, These volunteers and professionals make numerous sacrifices and give up valuable time and energy to make sure that they are properly trained and knowledgeable within their volunteer and professional lives; and

WHEREAS, The Firefighters, Law-Enforcement Officers, and Emergency Medical Service Workers must frequently leave family, friends, and the safety of their surroundings to save a life, protect property and to prevent disasters from spreading; and

WHEREAS, To honor those men and women who bravely answered the call on September 11, 2001, we recognize the men and women who serve today throughout the great State of West Virginia by proclaiming the second Saturday of September “Heroes Day”;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the second Saturday of September is hereby designated as “Heroes Day” in Elkins, West Virginia.
