Mayor Proclaims January Human Trafficking and Stalking Awareness Month

Elkins W. Va., January 23, 2020: Last Thursday, Mayor Van Broughton proclaimed January Human Trafficking and Stalking Awareness Month.

Human trafficking refers to a range of criminal acts related to forcing people into slave labor or sexual servitude. Stalking is when someone repeatedly watches, follows, harasses, or threatens someone, making them feel unsafe.
